Dear Timberline Valley North Neighbors,

Your Timberline Valley North HOA Board of Directors sends warm summer greetings along with this update on neighborhood news.

We are pleased to share an update about the restoration work of the small pond between Timberline and Alpine drives. The sediment removal process was completed this spring, returning much of the pond to more than five feet in depth. The sediment that was removed will continue to dry over the next few months in the holding bag just south of the large lake. By Spring of 2024, that area will be ready to excavate, landscape, and return to its natural beauty!

In the meantime, the Board hopes you've enjoyed the color that has been added at the subdivision sign along Bradley Avenue. The Champaign Parks Department continues the work of maintaining the Flower Island that was installed in the spring.

As the summer months are in their homestretch, the Architectural Committee would like to remind all residents to submit Architectural Approval Forms prior to beginning any structural improvements on your home. **This includes solar panel installation**. Finally, the Social Committee would like to extend a warm invitation to our Second Annual Ice Cream Social. Please be aware that we share the outdoors with many species of animals including geese, possums, raccoons, coyotes, etc. If you have small pets you may not want to leave them out unattended in the late evening as several "critters", including coyotes, have been spotted in our subdivision. Call the local animal control office or police department for assistance if the animal poses a threat to public health or safety.

Fountains/Lake Updates

You probably have noticed the lakes look pretty good this season so far! There has been a lot of maintenance done on them and the lower temperatures helped earlier in the season to keep the algae and other aquatic plant growth to a minimum. Three of our four fountains are currently at the factory being assessed for repairs needed. These are 10+ year old fountains and may need replaced to newer/better technology to help with the aeration of the water. We are waiting to hear from the factory about repairs.

The small pond that had the sediment pumped out earlier this spring continues to be treated for new aquatic plant growth. Due to the newly excavated pond floor (post sediment removal) dormant aquatic seeds that were left behind in soil that makes up the new floor, now are sprouting continually. We will continue working with the lake control contractor on a new regimen for this renovated pond space.

SUBDIVISION CARE AND MAINTENENCE REMINDERS

- Homeowners with yards that back on Duncan Road, it is time to trim your trees up again so that there is at least 8' of clearance on the sidewalks (per the covenants) This is helpful for the safety of pedestrians and for our mowing contractor. Those in non-compliance with the covenants will receive notices.
- All garbage cans/toters must be out of sight when it is not collection day. Cans may not be left near the front of the house to improve the aesthetics of our neighborhood. Placing them on the side of your home near the rear or other less-visible place is appreciated! Those in noncompliance with the covenants will receive notices.
